## Did you know?



Swift Parrot Lathamus discolor

Swift Parrots are the world's fastest flying parrot reaching speeds of up to 100km/h & also the longest distance migrating parrot flying up to 5,000km on a return journey. From September to January they breed in east coast Tasmanian woodlands & nest in old trees with hollows. Swift Parrots fly north to mainland Australia & over-winter in a variety of flowering eucalypt forests, from box-ironbark country in Victoria to coastal forests in southern Queensland. Moving in flocks they're noisy & active & often seen hanging upside down feeding in flowers on nectar, galls, lerp & small insects. Endangered Swift Parrots fly along the Yarra & Plenty river 'woodland corridors' when migrating further north. In the Greenhills area of Greensborough, the protected Yellow Gum woodlands are important for resting & feeding. www.banyule.vic.gov.au/environment/ Growling Grass Frog

Litoria raniformis Growling Grass Frogs are found close to water in woodlands & shrublands across Victoria. They eat insects & occasionally smaller frogs & are one of the few frogs active by day. Males make a growl like 'crawark crawark crok crok crok' call. Females lay eggs in floating creamy coloured spawn that breaks up & sinks to the bottom of still water wetlands. Tadpoles are pinkish grey in colour with yellowish fins & feed on algae & a variety of wetland plants. Once common, they're now endangered with a patchy distribution. Growling Grass Frogs are found in some of Melbourne's wetlands near the Werribee, Maribyrnong & Yarra Rivers, & the Moonee Ponds, Merri, Edgars, Darebin & Dandenong Creeks. Pollution from oil, paint, cigarette butts, plastic & fertilisers kills our frogs. We can help by keeping our stormwater drains clean & clear of rubbish. www.connies.com.au

To celebrate National Tree Day, Kate from Bunnings helped the children plant a lemon tree and a range of vegetable seedlings in our veggie patch.



We hope to create opportunities for children to water, weed, mulch, plant, harvest and share fresh produce once our seedlings grow – we believe these concrete, hands-on experiences provide children with lifelong lessons such as the importance of caring for our environment and the joy that comes from growing and sharing your own fresh produce.



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We have started to investigate plants and are currently waiting for our broad bean seeds to start sprouting so we can observe how plants grow.

Greenhills Educators would like to remind you that they are always available to speak to you if needed as stated in the 'Family Handbook' below. You can contact them for an appointment via email, phone or in person at any time, to arrange a mutually appropriate time.

Communication (From the Greenhills Preschool Family Handbook)

It is most important to maintain an open, accessible communication link between the kinder and parents. We have an open-door policy and invite any questions and feedback. The Program book and story park stories are great ways to inform the parents as to what is happening at kinder.

Parents can request an interview if needed to discuss a matter about your child. Please approach the educator for an appointment so there is ample time to have your queries answered. It is advisable to notify your child's educator of any unusual or stressful situations which may affect your child. Please note that during session times it is not appropriate to discuss any problems as the educators are busy spending time with all the children.

## **Educator's Report**

#### Swift Parrots

So lovely to be back at Greenhills and meet all of the Swift Parrot children and their families. I wasn't the only new member of the Swift Parrots this term, we also welcomed two new children – William and Lydia to our group.

Art experiences have been offered to the children regularly by Debbie over the last couple of weeks. Golf ball painting, marble painting and spin art using a salad spinner. This has provided opportunities for the children to practice and improve their fine and gross motor skills, patience and persistence – it is tricky to roll those balls and you need muscles for the salad spinner! The studio has also produced lots of unique art pieces. We will be encouraging the children to work together with some group art activities over the next few weeks.





Promoting the love of reading and books is a major part of Jo's teaching and we have read quite a few so far. Reading during session at the snack table inside, has encouraged some children to take some time out to have a snack and a story. We have also been playing games, singing and sharing songs and dance as part of our group participation at meeting time. The children are getting quite skilled at packing away at the end of session, finding time to have snacks and sitting for longer periods of time.

We had a very successful first trip out the back door of kinder and walked along the path behind kindergarten and back through the front gate. The children and adults enjoyed the cold and were



very thankful that the rain held off. We will be building these trips up slowly over the coming weeks and plan to be taking the children to the large area of Yandell Reserve by the end of term. This is reliant on parent help so please consider putting your hand up if you can. We will be scheduling these early next week and will communicate the dates via Storypark.

We would love parents, grandparents, uncles etc. to come to kinder and share a hobby, interest or spend time with the children. This could be knitting, cooking, woodwork, playing an instrument. sewing, painting, reading a book or anything else you would like to share. Please let one of us know and we will organise a time.


