A Few Reminders:

Welcome to all of our new and returning families to Greenhills Preschool 2014.

No Kids in Hot Cars

On hot days, it's important to remember that children should never be left alone in cars. **No Exceptions. No Excuses.**

Leaving children in hot cars - even for a moment - can result in injury or death.

The temperature inside a car begins to rise as soon as the door closes, and within minutes it can be double the temperature outside. So if it is 30 degrees outside, it can be more than 60 degrees or more inside a car in just a few minutes.

With smaller bodies and underdeveloped nervous systems, young children are at much greater risk of life-threatening heatstroke, dehydration and other serious health risks.

Three new video ads about the dangers of leaving kids in cars on hot days have recently been launched.
