AGM

On Tuesday 10th of November we are holding our Annual General Meeting. As an incorporated association as part of our constitution we must hold an annual meeting and complete a number of tasks such as consider our financial position and elect roles for next year's committee.

It is important for all families to attend this meeting, not only to show your support to the teachers and committee that have worked hard to ensure the kinder runs smoothly all year but this is also a key opportunity to hear about the future management of Greenhills preschool. This year we have found it extremely difficult to fill the positions on the committee and due to financial pressures as a result of legislation and award changes, we have explored the possibility of cluster management. The cluster management subcommittee will report their investigations, findings and decision at the AGM to inform families of next steps for the kinder. Our educators will also put together a photo presentation of experiences the children have taken part in throughout the year to introduce Greenhills to new families but to showcase all of the wonderful learning your children have taken part in this year at kinder. Swift Parrots

We headed out into the reserve on our first Friday back at kinder with two parent helpers (Rob & Rachele) to search for nature's 'treasures'. We found lots of things feathers, leaves, flowers and 2 caterpillars – very hairy caterpillars! We also played tag and hide'n'seek.

There was lots of interest in bees and caterpillars so we read some books about both of them when we returned. We are hoping to find out some more about both these insects in the coming weeks.

Growing Sunflowers from seed

Building on our understanding of living things we are growing some sunflowers from seed that will be transplanted into our kinder once they get big enough.

These are being grown in snap lock bags taped to the window so the children can clearly see the seed germinating, with its roots and stem erupting from the seed.

Growling Grass Frogs

We have installed a 'banana hammock' in our relaxation area for the children to use when wanting some time on their own. Kinder can be a very busy place with lots of activity, so providing an area where children can relax their mind & body is an important part of helping children develop self regulation skills. The hammock is "like a big hug" and many friends have commented on how cosy they feel once wrapped up in the material.

Discussions with children about "transitions" has started to take place, with many children chatting about visiting their nominated schools for orientation. On Wednesday 11th Nov & Thursday 12th Nov we will be walking to Greenhills Primary School during our kinder sessions. The purpose of the excursion is for the children to visit a local primary school and gain an awareness of the school environment to aid in the transition from kindergarten to school. Excursion notices will be distributed into pockets soon.
