Educator's Report

Swift Parrots

We have been enjoying the colder weather as it adds a different dimension to children's play, both indoors and outdoors. We are looking forward to exploring the outdoor environment further, so please remember to provide warm clothing each session and a change of clothes. Families are welcome to bring gumboots and leave them at kinder if this is more convenient.

Current interests that have emerged include making gingerbread men in mud kitchen, using the 'rainbow stampers' creatively, dance/movement, imaginative play with dinosaurs, construction play and large block play.





Welcome to Harry, Siena and Billy who have recently joined the Swift Parrot group. It's been wonderful to see how children have invited them into play and helped them understand our routines. In the middle photo we are singing 'Happy Birthday' to our new friend Harry.



During reconciliation week (27th May- 3rd June) we listened to a story by Aunty Joy Murphy called 'Welcome to Country'. We introduced the term 'First People' and discussed how Australia is now made up of people from many countries. Introducing children to these concepts at a young age helps develop an early and positive awareness of differences between people and cultures.

We also read a story 'All my Friends and Me' developed by the Australian Human Rights Commission that aims to build belonging. Through this story we are addressing the idea that we all have similarities/differences such as eye, hair and skin colour, and celebrating how this makes us special. We learnt a new song 'Colours of Australia' and are looking forward to revisiting this and learning the actions.



As we approach the end of term, we are looking forward to introducing a 'gingerbread man' cooking experience and story as well as a fire gathering in preparation for our lantern walk in term three.
