Educator's Report Swift Parrots

During our two week lockdown our group has operated with fewer children in attendance. Our Swift Parrots have displayed wonderful independence skills during changes to routine, saying goodbye to family at the gate and making their own way inside the playroom. We shared a social story about adults wearing masks to protect us all. Our Swift Parrots were very knowledgeable regarding COVID 19 and were able to share information in a group. Some of the comments regarding where and why we wear masks included Celeste who shared with us 'wear in supermarket', Reuben 'Wear everywhere because coronavirus' and Logan 'It gives you a cough.' We emphasised the importance of personal hygiene, 'catching our coughs', using a tissue and washing hands thoroughly.







Our Swift Parrots have been excited to share their adventures with Honey bear in a small group. Having photos has helped to prompt each child's discussion and to help their friends ask questions. We have also reinforced our packing up routine, showing our Swift Parrots the 'finish cloth' to help them contribute to looking after our kinder environment.





As our Swift Parrots continue to learn and develop we have observed more collaboration and group play occurring. During our home time routine we introduced a simple group game 'Doggy doggy' where we take turns being the 'doggy' in the middle with the bone hidden behind one of our friends' back. We were impressed with how our group was able to keep the surprise from the doggy, take turns, patiently wait and follow instructions.

Educator's Report Growling Grass Frogs





During our recent working bee, our mud pit was widened to allow for more mud play! Our kinder friends have enjoyed utilising the extra space and using our new metal shovels and rakes to dig, move and smooth over the dirt. Mixing sand and water to create "cement" has also been popular and we have had many builders enjoy using the bricks to create structures such as "walls" and "drive ways."

This recent burst of cold weather brings a timely reminder to please make sure your child has a warm jacket and beanie for kinder. We ask that you please pack some spare clothing for your child (in the event they get wet) and provide a wet bag / plastic bag for their wet clothing. If your child is not dressing themselves at home, you might like to start practicing this skill together. Learning to get dressed builds your child's confidence and independence. Getting dressed is an important skill for children to learn – but it can be hard.

Recently we have observed the children's block building designs becoming more intricate and detailed. Friends are working collaboratively together to work on a design and are practicing their negotiating and turn taking skills during the building process.









You may have already heard all about Coach Phil from your child. Phil from Kidzplay has been setting up some fun and challenging sporting games and experiences for the children to enjoy at Greenhills. After Coach Phil says goodbye and has left for the day we often hear one of the children shout "Let's play Coach Phil" and the children take turns in pretending to be Phil and providing instructions to the rest of the group!





Kindergarten is the time when children are developing their social skills and gaining an understanding of how to interact positively with peers within a busy group environment. We have been having discussions with the children about personal space and have created our own booklet for the children to take home and read with their families. It has been great for us Educators to hear the children referring to the concept during their play and asking friends "not to pop my bubble." You'll find award-winning books and bestsellers, as well as old and new favourites. I recommend them because the books span a wide range of children's reading levels and interests and are inexpensive (some books cost as little as \$2).

It is easy to order. The **Book Club LOOP** platform for parents allows you to pay by credit card. Your child's order is submitted directly to school and the books will be delivered to class. You can place your child's order at **scholastic.com.au/loop** or by using the **LOOP** app, which can be downloaded from the App Store or Google Play.

Owning your own books is something special! I hope that you will encourage your child to order books this year. Each order helps earn free books and teaching materials for our classroom, however there is never any obligation to order. I know of no better way to encourage reading than to allow children to choose the books they want to read.

Health Reminder

Please be aware that it is important to keep children at home when unwell. Our COVID safety plan states that we must exclude from kinder:

Any staff, child or visitor who has a temperature over 37.5 degrees

Any staff, child or visitor who indicates any of the following:

- Fever
- Chills or sweats
- Cough
- Sore throat
- Shortness of breath
- Runny nose
- Loss of sense of smell or taste
- In certain circumstances headache, muscle soreness, stuffy nose, nausea, vomiting and diarrhoea may also be considered symptoms of COVID 19.

Children should not attend kinder, even if they have the mildest symptoms. Or if they are indeed unwell. Please remember to inform Educators if your child has undertaken a COVID test and please email the test results to: greenhills@ecms.org.au

We understand that this can be frustrating as we begin the kinder year but we appreciate your cooperation in following our guidelines and the Victorian government directive.

Recipe Corner

Beetroot Carrot Chocolate Mini Cake

Ingredients:

150g self-raising flour
1Tablespoon cocoa powder
90ml vegetable oil
150g brown sugar
2 eggs
100g milk chocolate chip
180g beetroot and carrot - finely
grated/processed



Method:

- 1. Preheat oven to 160C.
- 2. Sift flour and cocoa powder together. Set aside.
- 3. Whisk oil, sugar, eggs and flour mixture until combined.
- 4. Mix in chocolate chip and beetroot-carrot.
- 5. Dollop batter into lined or greased muffin pan, or any decorative pan you have.
- 6. Bake in the oven for 10-15 minutes, depending on the size.

Cakes are done when a skewer inserted into the middle comes out clean. They freeze well and make delicious, semi-healthy lunchbox treats.


