It stated that considering the contribution of play to children's development and learning, the outcomes of beginning 'formal learning' later than 4 and 5 years of age are very persuasive. Cultural competence and respect for diversity

are an important part of the *Early Years Learning Framework*. We aim to provide children with examples of the many ways identities and culture are recognised and expressed.

"Educators recognise that diversity contributes to the richness of our society and provides a valid evidence base about ways of knowing." We are also aware that this includes "promoting a greater understanding of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander ways of knowing and being" (EYLF, page 13)

To help us achieve respect for diversity Greenhills Preschool is a member of the FKA – multicultural resource centre where we continually borrow a range of early childhood multi cultural resources. This term we have introduced different languages to children, in the Growling Grass Frogs our friend Alyssa has taught us a song in Italian and Isabella's Mum Louisa has read us a story book in Greek. Throughout our kinder environment we have introduced some Aboriginal dreamtime stories, music and other materials to the children in our play spaces to ensure an awareness of different cultures is embedded in our program. The Swift Parrots enjoyed using Clapping Sticks to play along while singing 'Twinkle, twinkle little star' and exploring the many ways you can use the sticks as instruments.
