Educator's Report

Welcome to all of our new and existing families to Greenhills Preschool 2014.

It has been a very busy start to the year and we are delighted at how quickly children are settling in to the Kindergarten program. It's a time for the children to become familiar with their kinder environment, routines, expectations, new faces and names and they are all doing an exceptional job within both the 3 and 4 year old programs! It has been remarkable to already witness children helping others, slowly placing trust in their educators and developing friendships.

Over the last couple of weeks the educators have had the opportunity to observe children's strengths and skills and begin to form relationships with all our kinder friends. It is important to us to build warm, emotional relationships during this period as we know they are the foundation for helping children develop a sense of security and belonging.

We are currently in the process of organising each child's kinder journal. The journals are an interactive way to share our understanding of your child's learning and development. Just a reminder to please just look at your own child's journal as there are privacy issues we need to take into consideration. The journals will be located on the shelves beneath the sign in book. Also please take note that our program book is located outside, on the bookcase, just before you walk into the room. Please have a look through our group learning book as it contains the group goals we have set for the term, learning stories and reflections. Please feel free to write a comment in the family sections. We love to get feedback.

In both the Swift Parrot group and Growling Grass Frog group the children are enjoying gathering together for "meeting time" We use this time to discuss different ideas, routines and safety rules. Children are encouraged and provided with opportunities to feel empowered, to be an active member of their community as they share their ideas and thoughts. Another gathering time takes place at the end of the session where we sing some songs and read a story.

At Kinder we use many recycled resources to enable the children to create their beautiful masterpieces, to play imaginary games, to use in the sandpit and outdoor kitchen and many more experiences. Thank you to our families for all their donations and contributions to kinder. It is much appreciated.

Maybe you or a family member works in an industry that would be able to provide us with some materials. Here are some ideas:

- Builder Off cuts of small timber for hammering
- Printing Company Off cuts of paper, card, stickers etc
- Packaging Company Polystyrene plates, trays, boxes etc
- Plumber Small pieces of PVC pipe for sandpit and digging patch.
- Other things we can use every day are envelopes, stickers, old cards, corks, wrapping paper, beads, old computer disks, old keyboards, bottle tops, ribbon, buttons, material, scarves, small boxes for pasting, straws, paper plates, baskets and glass jars.

So before you throw anything out, please consider that we might be able to use it. If you do set yourself the task of collecting for us, then it would be most appreciated if you could make sure everything is cleaned and washed and suitable for the children to use.

Other donations we are currently seeking include:

- Potted plants
- Huge cardboard boxes
- Mirrors
- Plastic display pockets for use in the children's journals
- Pebbles/glass nuggets









A few reminders....

- Please have your children arrive at kinder with sunscreen on as well as a sun hat throughout term 1 and 4
- As children may be involved in messy play, it is advised they wear old clothes to kinder and have a change of clothing
- Remember to check your child's pocket for kinder, social and fundraising information
- We ask parents when packing your child's lunchbox, that eggs and nuts are **not** included. We have serious allergies that exist at kinder and would like to avoid any risk. If you are a parent on duty, it is also important that you become familiar with the information on our 'Health & Safety Information' notices (found on our bathroom wall).
