Educator's Report



As educators we are happy to report that both the Swift Parrots and Growling Grass Frogs are continuing to build those important relationships with us and their friends on a daily basis. We regularly observe children helping each other, responding to their friend's feelings and enjoying each other's company. Progressive snack has been a large part of the relationship building with lovely conversations occurring, new friendships formed and lots of laughter. Circle time is another component that both groups do on a daily basis. We sing songs, read books and dance but we also have important discussions about a variety of subjects. These all help us to get to know each other and have fun.

Being together as a group is another great way of building a sense of belonging and we have worked as a team on the following together:

Swift Parrots and Growling Grass Frogs:

- Planting our seedlings into our vegetable garden and are making sure we water them regularly.
- Caring for and respecting our kinder environment by clearing up after each kinder session.

Swift Parrots:

- Creating a 'Swift Parrot' sign for our pocket area.
- Investigating seeds and planting beans in jars.

Growling Grass Frogs

- Working together to implement numerous scientific experiments, taking group observations and reflecting on what may happen
- Taking care of Ned & Magda (our social puppets). We use the puppets at meting time to help discuss different social scenarios

We have now organised all the children's Kinder journals which are

stored in the shelving where the sign in book is located. We encourage you to look through these at any time and we will be sending them home at the end of the term and welcome your feedback. Our program book is on display every session and again we encourage you to read through it and make written comments.

Both the Swift Parrots and Growling Grass Frogs are enjoying the many spaces provided for open ended play. Through the use of Intentional Teaching we are also sharing our interests and knowledge with the children in many different ways. We encourage you to share your expertise, interest or career with the children as well. So please come and talk to us if this is something you would like to do.
